


Advent Sunday 1st December 2025

We begin the Advent season this Sunday and our preparations for Christmas and the incarnation. This liturgical year, in our lectionary, we are in what is called 'Year C' and there is a particular focus on the Gospel of Luke. All are welcome to join us.

It will focus on the birth of Jesus through the lens of the three Gospel writers: Week 1 Matthew (chapters 1 and 2), Week 2 Luke (chapter 1 and chapter 2 verses 1-40), Week 3 John

(chapter 1 verses 1-18).

The only preparation people need to do is to read the gospel accounts before the meeting.

Jeremiah 33 I will cause a righteous branch to spring up for David

This is a lovely reading for the beginning of Advent, especially considering it comes from the Book of Jeremiah and some of his more sombre prophecies. The promise of a whole righteous branch of David's descendants, which we now know included Jesus's family tree. The promise which we will be thinking about during Advent.

Originally, I was just going to draw the one line, the green 'righteous' branch, but I felt drawn to putting in the other branches arising from David, and branching off the branch of righteousness, and that made me think of the significance of those other branches? The branches arising further back and the branches arising from Jesus's brothers and sisters? Who are their descendants? With so much mixing of populations during the 2 thousand years since then, and probably nearly 200 generations; could I be descended from King David, and could you? How does that make you feel? be provided. There will be hot chocolate served in the hall after the service. We take a collection for the work of the Children's Society.


On Christmas Eve our **Crib service** has a nativity performance by the Sea Lights children. Our collection will be for Embrace the Middle East. All welcome at both services.
